

Role – Chairperson of Loch Lomond Fisheries Trust



The Loch Lomond Fisheries Trust (the Trust) is an environmental charity formed in 2001 to champion the conservation and restoration of Loch Lomond's native fish populations, their habitats and the freshwater environment.

We are seeking a new Chair as Charlie Frize will step down in 2023, following a successful five-year tenure in post. We are looking for an individual who can continue to build and grow on our successes.

Role: The Chair of the Trust is a non-executive role suitable for a passionate individual seeking to lead an organisation at the forefront of improving conditions for wild fish stocks in one of Scotland's premiere natural fisheries.

Remuneration: Legitimate and reasonable out of pocket expenses only

Location: Central Scotland preferred (but could be remote)

Time commitment: 1- 3 days per month, consisting of;

- 4 x Trust Board meetings per annum (on-line or in person)
- 1 x Annual General Meeting (in person, Central Scotland)
- Stakeholder engagement meetings (various, Scotland)
- Strategy/Planning meetings (on-line or in person)

Individual Responsibilities –

- Chair Quarterly Board meetings and the Annual General Meeting
- Maintain regular communication with the Trust's senior executive.
- Conduct annual performance review of Trust senior executive.
- Represent the Trust and build relationships at senior level with external stakeholders, funders and supporters (Loch Lomond Angling Improvement Association, riparian owners, LLTNP, Marine Scotland, FMS etc.)
- Write Chairperson's message for Trust Annual Report
- Recruit Board members of Trust

Together with other Board Members -

- Set Trust long-term (5-year) strategic plan and review progress against targets at least annually / revise as required
- Ensure Trust is run in line with constitution.
- Approve annual Trust budget (usually February)
- Review quarterly financial reports and annual accounts

- Ensure operational, financial and ethical standards of the Trust are legally compliant and in line with or better than other equivalent organisations
- (When/if required) manage recruitment of Trust senior executive.
